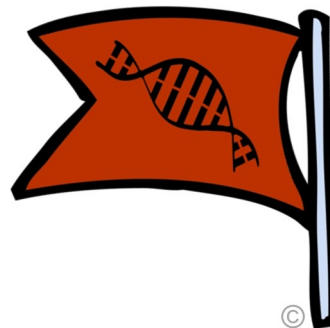


# **RED FLAGS** *for* **HEREDITARY CANCER CHECKLIST**

- Breast, colorectal, or uterine cancers under the age of 50.**
- Triple-negative breast cancer. (Breast cancer with no estrogen, progesterone, or HER2 receptors on the tumor.)**
- Male breast cancer diagnosed at any age.**
- Two separate cancer diagnoses in the same family member.**  
*Example: Both pancreatic and breast cancers in one individual.*
- Ovarian cancer at any age, especially in younger women.**
- A known BRCA , Lynch syndrome, or other pathogenic hereditary cancer mutation in the family. And that can be in a close genetic relative or one separated by many degrees.**
- Being of Ashkenazi Jewish descent with a history of cancer at any age.**
- Multiple family members with the same type of cancer or related cancers (*like breast and ovarian*).**
- Pancreatic cancer at any age.**
- Metastatic prostate cancer.**
